STRENGTHS-BASED APPROACHED

CIS Site Coordinators work in partnership with campus administration, teachers, and parents to create a multi-tiered service plan to address the needs of each individual student. After receiving parental consent, CIS Site Coordinators tailor individual and group services to the needs of the student.

Through a strengths-based approach CIS draws on students' personal strengths and existing support within their community. **These steps allow early intervention to prevent emerging issues from becoming serious concerns that lead to academic deficits.** CIS Site Coordinators regularly monitor each case managed student's academic progress, adjusting services as needs arise while continually collaborating with teachers and parents to ensure students stay on a path of success, **leading to on-time grade-level promotion, higher stay in school rates, and successful high school graduation.**

CLOSING THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP

CIS of Texas provides prevention and intervention services to positively impact students' academic success. For Pre-K through 5th grade in the 2023-2024 school year:



55,760 students received targeted academic support and services.



88% of students improved in their academic goals.



99% of students promoted to the next grade.

COST-EFFECTIVE SCHOOLWIDE SUPPORT

CIS affiliates leverage state funding with additional public and private fundraising from local communities. **For every \$1 invested by the state, CIS provides \$4.78 in services.** This cost-efficient model, which is unique to CIS, multiplies the impact of state funding and allows CIS to help more students in need.

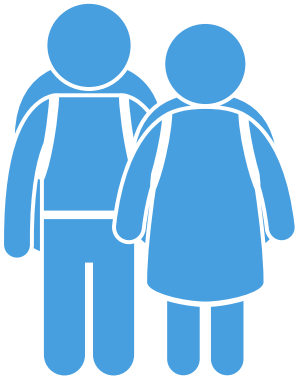
